

Compassion for Haiti

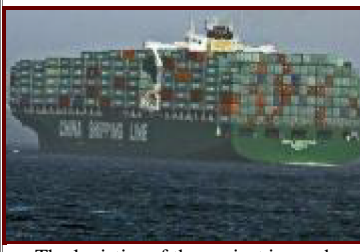

The Port Authority of New York-New Jersey, as well as other ports around the country, has thousands of strong shipping containers that are no longer being used, for one reason or the other.



These containers are strong, waterproof and can be utilized, with moderate effort, to provide an ideal short or even long term housing solution, in this emergency case.



The logistics of the project is much simpler than it may, at first sound. Further, containers are superior and far longer lasting, than tents.



The containers can be transported quickly and easily, even to isolated, remote areas, with the equipment available.



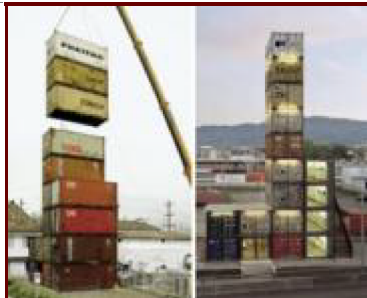
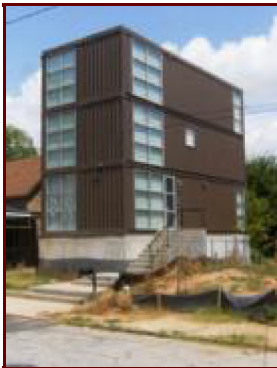
Initially, these containers can be used, but the Haitian people, as is, without any modification.



Through the ingenuity of the Haitian people, with minimum materials, effort and tools, these containers can be converted to comfortable living quarters and improved over time.



The Haitians may well be using these containers, for years to come.



In theory, the containers can be used as building blocks for larger structures, though I envision each container used as a single small dwelling.



These are a few things that can be done with the containers.
